INTRODUCTION

Since its initial discovery over forty years ago, dramatic progress has been made in the understanding of HIV pathogenesis and management. Combination Antiretroviral Therapy (cART) has indeed transformed a deadly infection into a chronic condition; nonetheless, PLWH on cART are unable to eradicate the infection and face a multitude of non-infectious comorbidities, which represent significant challenges in the management of this condition. Similarly, while the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic appears to be under control, questions have arisen regarding the timing of vaccination in both immune-competent and immune-depressed individuals, indication for treatment in asymptomatic individuals and management of Post-Acute SARS-CoV-2 Condition (PASC). Lastly, multi-drug resistant bacteria are an ever-growing threat and account for a considerable degree of morbidity in hospital settings. Italy is one of the EU Member States with the highest rate of resistance. The Italian Ministry of Health has launched an ambitious programme, the PNCAR, to contain this phenomenon and ID specialists are implementing Antimicrobial Stewardship measures accordingly. The present Conference aims to shed light into the pathogenesis and management of HIV and sexually-transmitted disease, SARS-CoV-2 and health-associated infections through themed discussion and presentation of original data.
